## What to Do After An Auto Accident?



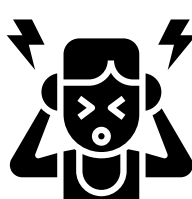
Stop your vehicle, and pull into a safe area away from traffic if you can.



Check yourself and your passengers an for injuries.



Call 911 or call the local police station.



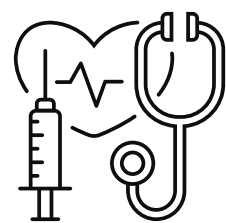
Keep calm. **DO NOT ADMIT FAULT.**



Collect information.



Cooperate with Police.



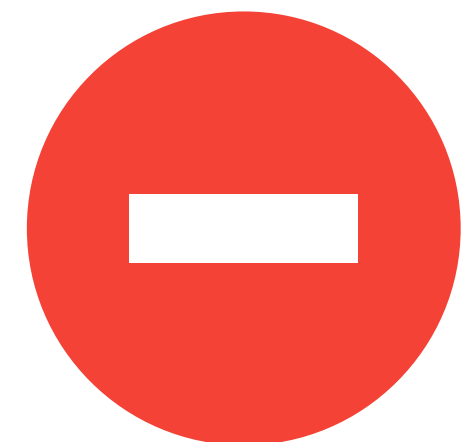
See a doctor and document your injuries.

## Important Documents You Should Save After An Accident.

- Police Report.
- Hospital Discharge Papers.
- Any X-ray/MRI/CT-scans and other diagnostic test reports and CDs.
- Medical Records from your doctors/ treatment facilities.
- Any business cards for the doctors you treated with.
- Any correspondence with insurance companies.
- Medical Bills.

## DO NOTS

- **DO NOT GIVE A VOLUNTARY STATEMENT TO THE INSURANCE COMPANY.**
- **DO NOT ADMIT FAULT.**



## What information should I collect at the scene of an accident?

- From the other driver:
  - Name & address
  - Driver's license number
  - License plate number,
  - Insurance company name and policy number.
- (Provide your information to them as well as the police officer).
- From witnesses:
  - Name & address
  - Phone number
- From the Police:
  - Get a copy of the police report number and a business card or name and badge number of the officer.

## Take Photos

of the scene, damage to all cars, any injuries you sustain and any the driver's license, license plate number, and insurance documents.

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
